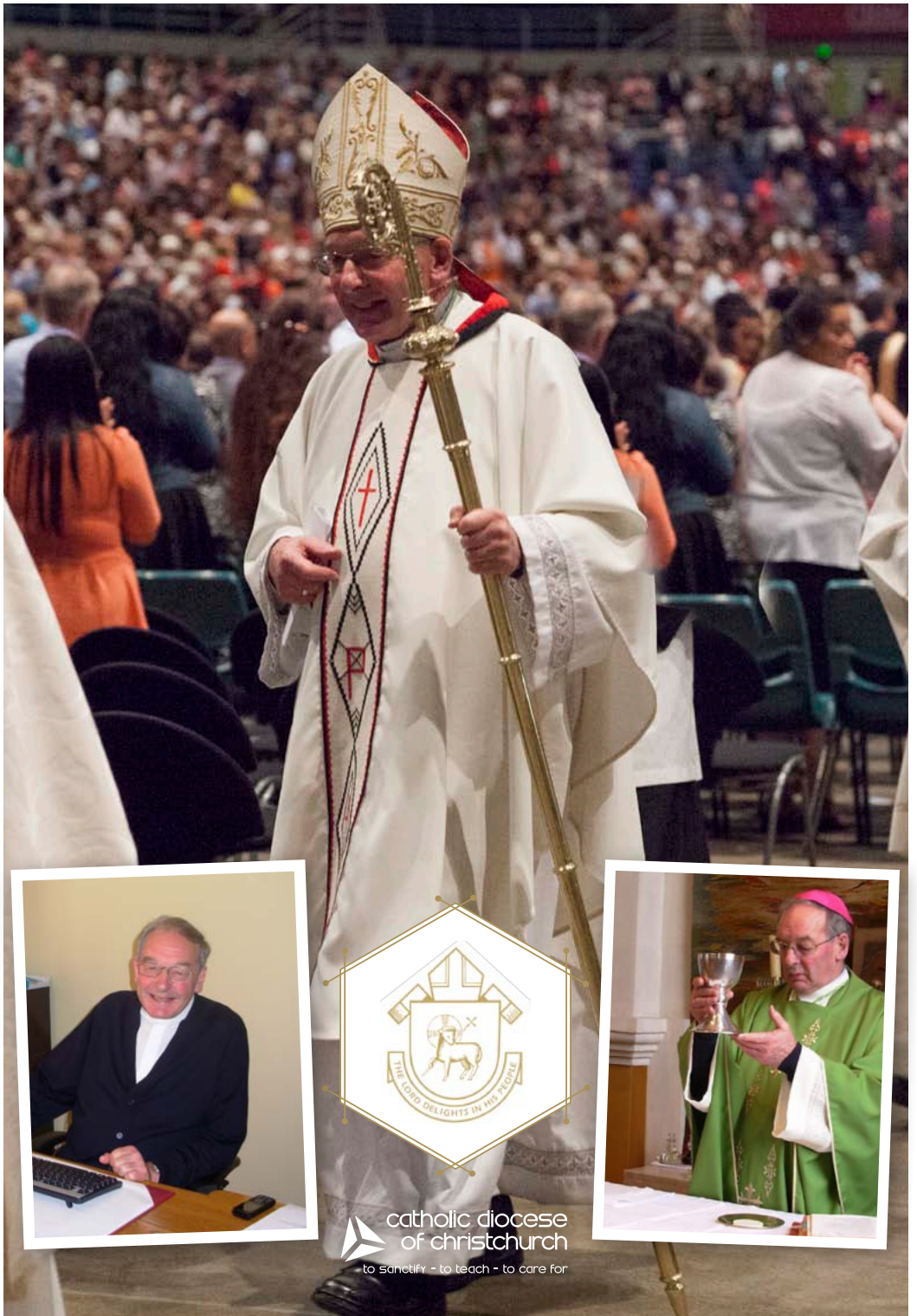
Hail, Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy,
